

FACTS AND FIGURES: ROHINGYA 2017

Aid in numbers

- Donations since 2017: **CHF 11,417,569**
- Donations since the 23 May 2018 fundraising day: **CHF 6,801,199**
- Amount spent on or earmarked for projects (by early September 2018): **CHF 4,554,847**
- Two projects **totalling CHF 1,600,000** are currently under study
- Number of projects carried out to-date: **14**
- Current estimated number of beneficiaries: **265,000**

According to the UN, over 700,000 people of the Rohingya ethnic minority have fled Rakhine State in northwestern Myanmar to seek refuge in Bangladesh since late August 2017. Witnesses have described scenes of unprecedented armed violence and of villages burnt to the ground. Distressed by a highly difficult exile, they are cohabiting in the world's largest refugee camp with around 200,000 other displaced Rohingya people who arrived in Bangladesh earlier.

What happens to your donations?

Your donations enable our partner NGOs to carry out projects which respond to the specific needs of these displaced people, who are also affected by severe weather brought on by the monsoon:

- They build wells to provide the Rohingya with safe drinking water
- They distribute household items and materials to build or repair shelters
- They treat the sick and injured
- They reinforce shelters and build or reinforce latrines and wells to protect the Rohingya from the impacts of the monsoon
- They protect children from exploitation and abuse and help people of all ages overcome their traumas
- They provide the Rohingya with important information on life within the camp
- They care for children who were separated from their parents as they fled danger

In concrete terms, what do the funded NGOs do?

Project: Distribute cooking gas, repair wells, baths and latrines, distribute materials and promote hygiene

Project: Reinforce shelters (specifically with concrete columns) before and after the monsoon, carry out terrain stabilisation work, build latrines and promote sanitary practices
