



## FACTS AND FIGURES: 2018 TSUNAMI IN INDONESIA

### Aid in numbers

- Donations since the 5 October 2019 fundraising day: **CHF 13,768,205**
- Amount spent on or earmarked for projects (mid-October 2019): **CHF 6,147,687**
- Number of projects launched: **17**
- Estimated number of current beneficiaries: **176,300**

On September 28, 2018, an earthquake and subsequent tsunami struck the Palu region on the Indonesian island of Sulawesi. In their wake, they left nothing but scenes of devastation. By the time the dust had settled, 4,340 people had lost their lives, 130,000 more were displaced and 109,000 were still living in precarious conditions months after the disaster. The tidal wave and soil liquefaction devoured individual homes, public buildings, roads, water networks and crops, depriving countless families of their livelihoods.

### What happens to your donations?

Thanks to your donations, our partner NGOs are carrying out projects which respond to the needs of affected populations, everything from emergency relief in the critical first moments after the disaster, to rebuilding efforts, which are ongoing:

- They distributed tents, blankets and essential items to people whose homes were destroyed.
- They are rehabilitating damaged healthcare centres and classrooms.
- They are distributing medical supplies to people with disabilities and providing them and their families with financial support.
- They are repairing pipelines to provide clean water to affected villages.
- They are providing farmers with seeds, tools and subsidies to refurbish their farmland and repair irrigation systems.
- They are building latrines and rehabilitating infrastructures to stave off the spread of disease.
- They are helping the public repair or rebuild their damaged homes.
- They are providing temporary shelter to people whose place of origin has been categorised as a “red” zone due to unstable land conditions or proximity to coastlines and therefore cannot return to it.
- They are planning to provide financial support to help families rebuild their homes on their own farmland, once allocated, in inland “green” zones.
- They are supporting women and men who once earned income for their families, in order to help them restart their activities.

In concrete terms, what do the funded NGOs do?

## ADRA

Project: Assistance to people affected by the tsunami, direct financial assistance, distribution of hygiene kits, jerry cans, cooking sets and fuel.

Duration: 01.10.2018 to 28.05.2019

Amount: CHF 286,455

Project: Economic recovery for affected families who earn a living primarily from agriculture; specifically, this involves the rehabilitation of irrigation canals.

Duration: 01.05.2019 to 31.05.2020

## CARITAS

Project: Emergency relief after the tsunami, water filters, lamps, blankets, hygiene kits.

Duration: 01.10.2018 to 28.02.2019

Amount: CHF 300,000

Project: Generating short-term income for families affected by disaster, direct financial assistance.

Duration: 01.01.2019 to 31.03.2019

Amount: CHF 195,671

Project: Helping families regain their livelihoods, direct financial assistance, hygiene kits.

Duration: 01.05.2019 to 30.04.2020

Amount: CHF 600,000

## CBM

Project: Medical care for people whose disability hinders their access to health services, mobile clinics, home visits, medical supplies, physiotherapy sessions.

Duration: 01.10.2018 to 28.02.2019

Amount: CHF 137,053

Project: Direct financial assistance for the most vulnerable people (people with a disability, elderly people and those living with an illness).

Duration: 01.04.2019 to 30.11.2019

Amount: CHF 200,000

Project: Assistance to help vulnerable people (disadvantaged minorities, elderly people, people with a disability) become self-sufficient.

Duration: 01.11.2019 to 30.08.2020

Amount: CHF 300,000

## SWISS RED CROSS

Project: Sulawesi: emergency intervention following the disaster, direct financial assistance to meet basic needs, rehabilitation of healthcare centres, medical care, water and sanitation.

## HEKS

Project: Emergency relief following the earthquake, temporary shelters, distribution of mattresses, blankets, hygiene kits and kitchen utensils.

Duration: 01.10.2018 to 28.02.2019

Amount: CHF 373,742

Project: Temporary shelter for people affected by the tsunami, rehabilitation of damaged homes, sanitation and financial assistance for rehousing.

Duration: 01.03.2019 to 30.03.2020

Amount: 800,00 CHF

## MEDAIR

Project: Distribution of emergency supplies, including materials with which to build shelters for families whose homes were destroyed or damaged during the disaster, and direct financial assistance.

Duration: 1.10.2018 to 31.03.2019

Amount: CHF 300,000

## SAVE THE CHILDREN

Project: Emergency relief for children affected by the tsunami, hygiene kits, support for unaccompanied children and those in emotional distress as a result of the disaster.

Duration: 01.10.2018 to 31.12.2018

Amount: CHF 295,198

Project: Building temporary classrooms in schools damaged by the earthquake, repairing damaged schools.

Duration: 01.11.2019 to 31.08.2020

Amount: CHF 780,349

## SOLIDAR

Project: Emergency relief, distribution of filters to make water drinkable, hygiene kits, building of latrines.

Duration: 01.10.2018 to 28.02.2019

Amount: CHF 299,941

Project: Helping coastal communities return to their business and agricultural activities by distributing equipment and repairing damage caused by the tsunami.

Duration: 01.03.2019 to 30.06.2019

Amount: CHF 200,000

Project: Restoring the livelihoods of micro-entrepreneurs, a majority of whom are women, by means of subsidies and training to help them restart their businesses.

Duration: 01.07.2019 to 30.06.2020

Amount: CHF 600,001
